CEO Report

Providing Direct Feedback to Government



Although I continue to be challenged with taking selfies, here I am getting ready to enter the Pre-Budget Lock Up.

The provincial government announced its update to the 2017 Budget this past Monday and ASPECT had the opportunity to participate in the Pre-Budget Lock Up. For those of you who may not know, this is the opportunity for the press and stakeholders to get "locked up" in advance of the official Budget release to read the Budget documents, ask questions of government staff, prepare media releases, and conduct media interviews.

Now that it's Friday, I'm sure that you've all read or heard about the budget and know that

many of the issues related to employability are addressed: housing, transportation, mental health and addictions, and daycare (which was promised \$20 million, but no detail about where that would be spent). Budget documents can be found on the government website.

Providing Direct Feedback to Government

At our meeting last week with the Minister of Social Development and Poverty Reduction, Hon. Shane Simpson has shared with us his plans to introduce a Poverty Reduction Strategy for BC in Spring of 2018. Currently BC is one of two provinces in the country without such a strategy.

Accordingly, we have planned a new session for the <u>ASPECT Conference</u> in November. At this facilitated workshop, we will discuss the questions below and create a briefing paper for government from your answers. It is hoped that initiatives put forward by government will have a full range of ideas from the employment sector.

- 1. What are we doing in the employment services sector that supports the government's poverty reduction goals?
- 2. What is needed from government to enhance what we are doing?

Whether you are a service provider for federal or provincial employment programs, having the experts (our members) in the room will be helpful.
